The 2014-2015 school year we have the incredible opportunity to learn about the Chinese culture with our own Mrs. Strub! As an IB candidate school, the Beaverton School District has provided the language teacher through the title II grant funding. Students will learn all about another culture through language, literature, interaction and song. IB schools offer world language opportunities so that students gain perspective on another culture. Language will be taught and emphasized, however it is not a language speaking class, but more an opportunity to gain perspective and help Hiteon students become internationally minded.

Mrs. Strub, a vivacious kindergarten teacher at Hiteon, has a passion for her Chinese culture! She is excited to bring the Chinese world to life and help bridge Eastern and Western cultures through multicultural perspectives as our full time language teacher.
