Principal Report- Meghan Warren

- Science expo wonderful event
- Lock out surprise drill- Public safety office and Beaverton District reps came and surprised us with a drill.
- Our School Resources officer, Dan Cotton, is running a lot of drills with front office to help train muscle memory
- Starting staffing season and making decisions about next year.
 - Projected to have basically the same enrollment.
 - Will gain student success coach half time.
- Smarter Balance assessments begin in about a month- they will all test in their classrooms on their chromebooks.
- Dudes with Donuts- Parking issues with parents parking in no parking zones. There will be increased patrols for illegal parking.

Budget Review

- We still have 68,000 for the year.
- Reviewed grant/curriculum requests
 - \$86.62- 1st grade curriculum- making slime for science projects
 - \$590- 4th grade curriculum- hydroponic plant growers- to grow all year long not just during good weather.
 - \$69.03- 4th Grade curriculum- Circuit inquiry kits
 - \$715.76- Grant request by 1st grade- OSMO ipad base- two per class for total of 8. Plus a couple of games to go with it. The OSMO will help kids explore coding.
- Still funds to be spent
- There is always a current copy of the budget hanging in the PTC room.

Walk and Bike to school- Lynne Murtrie

- Goal is to increase walking and biking and bussing throughout the school district.
- It decreases traffic and makes a safer neighborhood
- Survey last May- At Hiteon 100% of the kids have the options. 58% of the kids are driven in the morning. 41% in the afternoon.
- Biggest concerns- speed of traffic
- Walking school bus- Sexton Mountain does it every Thursday
- Bethany Elementary- Funded RFB- flashing beacon for one of their busy crossings.

- Discussion of bus drivers- rotating bus drivers makes it more likely that parents will drive

South Beaverton Neighborhood Project- Jen Christy
