xīn nián kuài lè 新年快乐 Happy Chinese New Year!

This year we welcome the Year of the Rooster! In Language and Culture class, we have been having fun learning about the origins, customs and celebrations that surround this special holiday.

When the subject of Chinese New Year was introduced, students immediately asked if they would get to have a treat in class again this year. Thanks to the PTC (Parent Teacher Community) we will be able to continue this popular tradition.

This year, **Kindergarten** will be given one piece of rice candy. The rice candy will be given to the students in a traditional "hóng bāo" or red envelope. Red envelopes are typically filled with money and given by adults to children for Chinese New Year. The color red symbolizes good luck!

First through fifth graders will be offered a "chā shāo bāo" Chinese steamed pork bun. Each student will be offered ½ of a bun. A bun is approximately the size of a small bagel.

This lesson will occur between February 9th – February 16th. Your child will participate when he/she attends Language class.

Grades 1st-5th -- Okami Bao Steamed Pork buns (Costco):

Filling: pork, water, sugar, wheat starch, soy sauce (water, soybeans, wheat, salt), oyster flavored sauce (water, sugar, salt, oyster extractives [oyster, water, salt], modified corn starch, caramel color), unbleached enriched flour (malted barley flour, niacin, reduced iron, thiamine mononitrate, riboflavin, folic acid), spices, sesame seed paste, caramel, garlic, paprika powder, turmeric powder. Wrapper: unbleached enriched flour (malted barley flour, niacin, iron ascorbic acid, thiamine mononitrate, riboflavin, folic acid), water sugar, shortening (palm), baking powder (sodium acid pyrophosphate, sodium bicarbonate, corn starch, monocalcium phosphate), yeast.





Some Benefits of Being a Primary Years Programme School!

At the PTC meeting this week, we shared about the shifts in learning that our students are experiencing and the benefits to our Hiteon community. Some of the benefits include:

- <u>Common Language</u> students from Kindergarten to 5th grade are using the PYP Attitudes
 and Attributes as they refer to behavior and a person's character. Students are practicing
 and becoming inquirers, communicators, principled, caring, balanced, thinkers, risk-takers,
 reflective, open-minded and knowledgeable. This common language allow all staff members to
 give compliments and guide students in regards to behavior and expectations.
- <u>Teacher Guided and Student Driven</u> students are required to think and take responsibility for their own learning.
- <u>High Engagement</u> because PYP is student driven, there is an increased engagement in the inquiry process of learning. Students are encouraged to ask questions, discover new facts and communicate with others.



• <u>Skills for learning</u>- Through the inquiry process, students engage in building skills that will help them as they progress through school and life. Students learn and practice the following skills throughout the 6 transdisciplinary units: social, communicating, researching, thinking, and self-management.
